SEPTEMBER 15, 2003 -- The Colorado Performing Arts Festival provides an opportunity to discover the world of performing arts in a fun, friendly and stimulating atmosphere. The festival takes place in the Denver Performing Arts Complex on Saturday,

September 20 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and on Sunday, September 21 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The festival is the largest free performing arts event in the state, and it is designed to offer a wide sampling of the performing arts. It features over 100 ensembles and performers offering all types of music, dance and theatre. Other performances during the weekend include those by Hannah Kahn Dance, poetry by Sirious, Flamenco Fantasy Dance Theatre, Tango Colorado, Ballet Arts Theatre, the Colorado Wind Ensemble, the Denver Jazz Orchestra, Japanese koto by Waves of Peace, African drums by Joda & Friends, music by Grupo Folklorico Sabor Latino, Chris Daniels & Kings, the Nelson Rangell Jazz Quartet and many more. The festival is produced by the Mayor's Office of Art, Culture and Film and Denver Theaters and Arenas, with additional support from community and



media partners. Many of the festival performers are recipients of funding from the Scientific and Cultural Facilities District (SCFD), which is celebrating its 15th anniversary this year.
